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Goals for Probate Monitoring

1. Every respondent who leaves Summit Behavioral Health Care will be seen within two weeks after admission at their new placement. Contact will also be made with the case management agency to coordinate care.
2. Every respondent who leaves an acute care hospital will be seen within two weeks after their hospital discharge. Contact will also be made with the case management agency to coordinate care.
3. Every respondent who leaves Great Miami Services will be seen within three weeks after discharge. Contact will also be made with the case management agency to coordinate care.
4. Every respondent who moves from one housing situation to another, whether it is a more restricted setting or lesser restricted setting, will be seen within three weeks after the move. Contact will also be made with the case management agency to coordinate care.
5. Every situation regarding a respondent who generates a Notice of Important Concern will be addressed within two working days with a phone call to the author of the notice. A home visit will be scheduled if needed. These situations include hospitalization, eviction, arrest, medication non compliance, and treatment non compliance.
6. All respondents will be seen in the month preceding their scheduled probate court hearing. Contact with the case management agency to coordinate care will be made if needed.
7. Review, and respond if necessary, to monthly case management reports sent to the Probate Court Monitor by the treating agency.
8. Attend all treatment team meetings at Residential Care Facilities in which probate respondents reside.
9. Coordinate care with the Mental Health Board and the Probate Court regarding the respondent's living situation, treatment agency, and other necessary information regarding treatment.
10. Produce the Probate Court Monitor's Report on each respondent prior to their review hearings. This report is used by the Court as a summary of the respondent's treatment course since the last review hearing.
